"Your natural hair - permanently restored."

What is Hair Transplantation?

Hair transplantation is a procedure where hair follicles from a **donor area** (usually the back or sides of your scalp) are moved to **balding or thinning areas**.

✓ Your own natural hair

- ✓ Grows permanently
- ✓ Can be cut, styled, or shaved like normal hair

Main Techniques

1. FUE – Follicular Unit Extraction

- Hair follicles are extracted one by one using a micro punch
- No stitches
- Tiny dot-like scars, nearly invisible
- Quick healing, less discomfort
- Suitable for people who prefer short hairstyles
- Becovery: 5–7 days
- \mathbb{P} Ideal for: Mild to moderate hair loss, early stages of baldness

2. FUT – Follicular Unit Transplantation (Strip Method)

- A thin strip of scalp is removed from the back of the head
- Individual follicles are prepared under a microscope
- Donor area closed with stitches, leaves a **linear scar** (hidden under hair)
- 🕒 Recovery: 10–14 days
- P Ideal for: Patients with advanced hair loss who need a larger number of grafts

3. Combination of FUE + FUT

Best of both worlds

- First, FUT is done to get a large number of grafts
- Then, FUE is used to extract **additional grafts** from around the strip or beard/body

Maximizes graft yield in a single session

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- Advanced baldness (Norwood 5-7)
- Repeat transplant (if donor area is limited)
- Dense hairline + crown coverage

Scarring	Tiny dots	Linear scar	Both (hidden well)
Graft yield	Moderate	High	Very High
Recovery Time	5–7 days	10–14 days	7–10 days
Best For	Early/moderate baldness	High-grade baldness	Maximum coverage in one go
Shaving Required?	Usually yes	Usually no	Depends on strategy
Repeatability	Yes	Limited	Maximized donor use

Who is it for?

- FUE: Young patients, small bald areas, short hairstyle lovers
- FUT: Need more grafts in one session, long hair hides scar
- Combo: High-grade baldness, limited donor zone, second-time transplant

Hair transplantation is not **one-size-fits-all**. The right technique depends on your **baldness level**, **donor area**, and **personal goals**.
